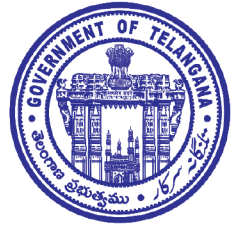

Organ Donation from a Brain dead person (deceased donor) gives new life to many patients with end stage organ disease. Come let us all get together and make everybody know the immense importance of organ donation.

Life is very precious, let us make good use of our life even after our death by organ donation. It is sad but true that every human being is a mortal and we should remember the age old saying "from dust thou art and to dust thou shall return". If our organs are not utilized at the time of death by donation to others, they shall go for a waste.

Organ donation from brain dead to the needy has been initiated and publicized by state government programme "Jeevandan". Brain death is usually due to situations like trauma to brain, cerebrovascular accident, refractory brain elements but organs other than the brain continue to function normally while the patient is on ventilator. These functioning organs of the brain dead are retrieved and donated to the needful patients. Brain dead diagnosed people will never recover their brain function. Eventually develop cardiac death.

Consent for organ donation is never by compulsion and is completely voluntary. During life, every human being while at normal health can pledge to donate his or her organs at the time of death and these individuals are given donor cards.

Lakhs of people are suffering with end stage organ disease in India and world over are holding their breath eagerly waiting for somebody to donate the required organ to them. Unfortunately not many are coming forward to donate organs. Organ donation, done at the right time will appropriately benefit the needy persons.

State Government of Telangana has come up with cadaver transplantation programme called Jeevandan. It is a common platform for organ donation and organ allocation and transplantation across the Telangana State. Jeevandan has also taken up the responsibility of educating the public about the need of organ donation. This organization was started by the State Government in 2012. From January 2013 to July 2017, 374 brain death patients have donated their organs and 1533 organs & tissues were retrieved and transplanted to needy persons.

About 30 Hospitals have registered themselves in Jeevandan Scheme and thousands of patients from different states have been registered as prospective recipients. Jeevandan organization sincerely wishes that these end organ individuals live a good life in the days to come and wishes that our dreams are made to come true by each and every person by donating organs after their death.
